Pastor's Review:

- **Gen. 3:** (The foretelling of **Jesus Christ**)
- Isa. 7: Prophesy of Israel
- OT / written in Hebrew; NT / written in Greek
 - The Sign of Immanuel
 - Text applied to our **Savior.**
- Matt. 1: The Birth of Jesus Christ
 - Far reaching application; prophecy.
 - o Almah / young woman (Mt. 1:23) / Greek
 - o Betulah / virgin (Isa. 7:14) / Hebrew
- Why a necessity for a virgin birth?
 - (Jer 22:30) Thus saith the LORD, Write ye this man childless, a man that shall not prosper in his days: for



no man of his seed shall prosper, sitting upon the throne of David, and ruling any more in Judah.

- God cursed the descendent of David although He promised Jesus would be from David's lineage.
- Jesus doesn't call Mary and Joseph His parents.
- Emphasis the more where **Jesus** came from.
- Christ came by the power of God.
- God will never go against His nature!
 - He is holy, pure, always good; He is never wrong.
 - God sent in the fullness of time a Savior; He has always kept a remnant; He is coming back.
 - o Are you ready?

Chp. 24: Impending Judgment on the Earth

(Isa 24:1) Behold, the LORD maketh the earth empty, and maketh it waste, and turneth it upside down, and scattereth abroad the inhabitants thereof.

(Isa 24:3) The land shall be utterly emptied, and utterly spoiled: for the LORD hath spoken this word.

- This is a bad time; everyone suffers.
- The reason being because of rebellion against God.
- God wins in the end.



Chp. 25 Praise of God

(Isa 25:1) O LORD, thou art my God; I will exalt thee, I will praise thy name; for thou hast done wonderful things; thy counsels of old are faithfulness and truth.

(Isa 25:6) And in this mountain shall the LORD of hosts make unto all people a feast of fat things, a feast of wines on the lees, of fat things full of marrow, of wines on the lees well refined. (Isa 25:8) He will swallow up death in victory; and the Lord GOD will wipe away tears from off all faces; and the rebuke of his people shall he take away from off all the earth: for the LORD hath spoken it.

- These are prophesies in the NT.
- (Isa 40:31) But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.
- (Pro 3:5) Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.

(Isa 25:9) And it shall be said in that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, and he will save us: this is the LORD; we have waited for him, we will be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

Chp. 26: Song of Salvation

(Isa 26:1) In that day shall this song be sung in the land of Judah; We have a strong city; salvation will God appoint for walls and bulwarks.

(Isa 26:4) Trust ye in the LORD for ever: for in the LORD JEHOVAH is everlasting strength:

(Isa 26:8) Yea, in the way of thy judgments, O LORD, have we waited for thee; the desire of our soul is to thy name, and to the remembrance of thee.



Isaiah

- God's name is who He is; "I AM THAT I AM."
- Moses wanted to verbalize who God is, however there isn't a name that can do that; God Is!

(Isa 26:9) With my soul have I desired thee in the night; yea, with my spirit within me will I seek thee early: for when thy judgments are in the earth, the inhabitants of the world will learn righteousness.

(Isa 26:11) LORD, when thy hand is lifted up, they will not see: but they shall see, and be ashamed for their envy at the people; yea, the fire of thine enemies shall devour them.

- Wherever the **Lord** has provided to help a people, their hearts are not turned to **Him**.
- Two aspects of the grace of God:
 - o Common grace everybody enjoys this.
 - o Uncommon grace only the Believers receive.

(Isa 26:18) We have been with child, we have been in pain, we have as it were brought forth wind; we have not wrought any deliverance in the earth; neither have the inhabitants of the world fallen.

(Isa 26:19) Thy dead men shall live, together with my dead body shall they arise. Awake and sing, ye that dwell in dust: for thy dew is as the dew of herbs, and the earth shall cast out the dead. (Isa 26:20) Come, my people, enter thou into thy chambers, and shut thy doors about thee: hide thyself as it were for a little moment, until the indignation be overpast.

(Isa 26:21) For, behold, the LORD cometh out of his place to punish the inhabitants of the earth for their iniquity: the earth also shall disclose her blood, and shall no more cover her slain.
